Mystery on Black Mountain

The Northern Diversion

This is the journey you *have* to make. You must collect all seven letter clues and arrange them to spell the name of this bushranger. Your share of the reward is waiting at the Visitor Centre.

Warning: Do not step off the paths.

Remember – every word counts! ..and when in doubt, look at the pictures! The answer is there, but you have to find it ...and it's not easy! Can *you* find the bushranger's name?

- 1 Begin at the Education Amphitheatre. Seek your **first letter clue** under where others sit.



- 2 Walk quickly from this place. Head northward and westward along different paths, upward and along to where many paths meet between Rowan and Banks, buildings of red and green. Your second letter clue comes in instruction 4.
- 3 Here you will find a place of many paths. *Who Lives Here?* Follow the path to the first station where the web hangs in the tree. Be careful not to become the fly. Walk back to the place of many paths. The Main Path is marked with numbers (coloured black on grey) that are 10 big steps apart. You will know that you are on the right path when you find numbers 13 then 14, 15 and on...

- 4 Watch out for the trail that leads away on a *wide black path* – one that Indigenous peoples might take. Turn off the Main Path and follow it. Lomandra holds your **second letter clue**.



- 5 Follow the Aboriginal Walk till the Main Path you reach again. This is where the water falls and where circles grow around circles. The 4th circle holds your **third letter clue**.

- 6 Walk along to Main Path marker 102 where you must walk a full circle. Observe burrawangs closely but beware the fruit. The fourth letter clue is here. Beware others who seek the same treasure! Keep right and emerge by tall candlebark.



- 7 At Main Path marker 109 you can look around and down at the same time to find your **fifth letter clue**.

- 8 Backtrack to 107 where many paths cross. Walk on downward, but stay hidden in the forest, past wood of pencil and go where steps proceed further down.

- 9 From the right place on Epiphyte Landing, locate your **sixth letter clue**.
