Snakes Alive! at the Australian National Botanic Gardens

ACT Commissioner for Sustainability and the Environment, Dr Maxine Cooper, will open the *Snakes Alive!* exhibition at the Australian National Botanic Gardens on Monday 18 January at 12.15 pm.

Snakes Alive! runs from Monday 18 January to Sunday 24 January 2010.

Around 100 reptiles, representing over 30 different species, will be on display at *Snakes Alive!* – one of the most diverse reptile shows in Australia. It includes pythons, venomous land snakes, lizards, frogs, turtles, a crocodile and geckoes.

This year's display features the locally endangered corroboree frog, a death adder and a variety of Australian pythons. (People will actually be able to handle some of the pythons, always a favourite with the kids.)

Snakes Alive! is jointly presented by the Australian National Botanic Gardens and the ACT Herpetological Association. *Snakes Alive!* has been one of the Garden's most popular annual summer events since it started in 2002.
