The Garden Party also offers an exclusive (now sold out!) slow food banquet hosted by the Slow Food Convivium with menu planned and prepared by local chef Kim De Poorter. Slow Food fosters community awareness of food that is good, clean and fair – that the food we eat tastes good and should be good for us; that it is grown and made in ways that respect animals, the environment and our health; and that the producers who grow or create it should be fairly rewarded for their endeavour. With a menu inspired by bush food, it seemed holding the Corinbank Garden Party in the Australian National Botanic Gardens was meant to be!

Partygoers will experience some of the joys that the festival has to offer with three local bands – the James Fahy Trio, Beth 'n' Ben and Fun Machine all booked to play at Corinbank 2012.

"This will be the year of discovering the music bands you will love for the rest of your life" Corinbank's musical director Mark Bradley said. "You'll walk in with five favourite bands and walk out with many more new favourites."

The Corinbank Garden Party kicks off at 6pm this Saturday 15 October. A gourmet sausage sizzle and drinks will also be available for party goers who choose to picnic under the stars.
