Ingvariella Guderley & Lumbsch, *in* R.Guderley, H.T.Lumbsch & G.B.Feige, *Nova Hedwigia* 64: 152 (1997); named in honour of the Swedish lichenologist Ingvar Kärnefelt (b. 1944).

Type: I. bispora (Bagl.) Guderley & Lumbsch

Ingvariella bispora was excluded from *Diploschistes s. str.* due to the absence of a true exciple, this being replaced by a pseudoexciple of degenerating, pigmented hymenial elements. This monotypic genus has a world-wide distribution, but it is most common at higher elevations in semi-arid regions with winter rain.
