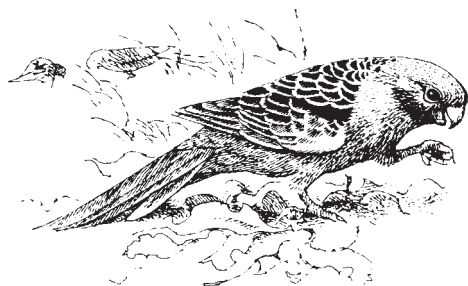

Hide 'n Seek

Choose a favourite gum tree nearby. Can you find some real animals hiding on it?

Later draw them on your tree and colour the picture.

1. Find the animals hidden in the tree.
2. Colour only the bark of the tree (not the animals).
3. Carefully choose the colour for each animal so that it can still hide on the tree.
4. Now colour in each animal.
